FORM & STYLE

Inspired by the leo stance, the Dominar 400 is designed for power. A low-slung saddle, a large contoured tank and formidable rear infinity lights build its massive presence. Premium body colours, redesigned mirrors and new tail lamp internals enhance its signature identity while the twin barrel exhaust imparts an imposing sports-tourer feel.





TECHNOLOGY

The reverse LCD split speedometer divides the display into primary and secondary console, allowing the rider to concentrate on the essentials. The Dominar 400 is equipped with the most advanced LED lighting technology- the first of its kind, a mosaic shaped full LED headlamp makes the bike visible from approximately 1.5 km away.

AGILITY

The Dominar 400 sports a massive perimeter frame coupled with a stamped metal swingarm to provide torsional rigidity and lateral strength. The resulting low centre of gravity offers superior control. A slipper clutch enables precise gear shifts at any RPM, and the low profile radial tires impart better stability while cornering.





PERFORMANCE

With 29.4 KW (40 PS) of power and 35NM of torque, the Dominar 400 propels from 0 to 100km/h in just 7.1 seconds. The roaring 373cc fuel injected, triple-spark 4-valve, DOHC engine has been refined further for unmatched performance. A lightweight forged crankshaft, and a high-speed gear train add more power with every twist of the throttle.

CONTROL

With a 320mm front disc and twin-channel ABS, the Dominar 400 goes from 100 to 0 km/h faster and safer. The up-side down (USD) front forks inspire superior handling and confidence when it comes to attacking corners - in all riding conditions. Ride with fearless precision.
